WHEN TO APPLY

The International Relations Office is happy to accept exchange student nominations from our partner institutions. Host institution coordinators will receive nomination instructions via email at the beginning of each cycle.

The home institution has to complete "Exchange Student Nomination Fom" with the basic information about the student selected for the exchange and submit it to College of Music, Mahidol University at least **two weeks** prior to the application deadline.

As soon as the international relations coordinators at MSMU receives a student's official nomination from their home university and the nomination has been validated, the International Relations Office will send an E-mail to incoming students to confirm their nomination, including instructions for required documents fulfilled.



ELIGIBILITY



Qualifications

- Applicants must currently be enrolled in at least second semester of the home university program.
- Applicants must fulfill the following GPA requirement.

Undergraduate: 2.5/4.0Graduate: 2.75/4.0

English Proficiency Requirements

A non-English native speaker should provide one of the following tests:

• TOEFL (IBT): 64 or above

• IELTS: 5.0 or above

*Language proficiency tests must be taken within the last two years.

**English language proficiency scores could be waived or superseded by a home institution's certifying letter stating that student's English proficiency is in a level of practical communication.





APPLICATION PROCESS



STEP: 1

Inbound exchange students are nominated by their home institutions, specifically indicating exchange semester periods, instrument, E-mail.

STEP: 2

The International Relations Office sends an E-mail to inbound students to confirm their nomination, including instructions for required documents fulfilled.



Inbound exchange students complete the application by the deadline.

(*Original documents are not required.)

STEP: 4

The International Relations Office issues the letter of acceptance to inbound exchange students for visa application and to their home institutions' coordinator for reference

STEP: 5

A welcome orientation is held approximately a week before the semester begins. It is hence recommended that the inbound exchange students arrive in Thailand a few days ahead of the orientation schedule.





Full-time Enrollment Requirements

Inbound exchange students are required to take for at least 9 credit hours per semester in order to be eligible a full-time student status and cannot take more than 22 credit hours for undergraduate students and 15 credit hours for graduate students.

Registration Process

Inbound exchange students are required to do an E-profile registration at least two weeks before the start of the semester. Online registration data: registered courses and class schedule will be provided in COMMAS.

PREPARATION BEFORE COMING TO THAILAND

The following checklist will help you have a smooth start to your student life in Thailand.



No. 01 – Insurance Requirements for Inbound Exchange Students

All exchange students are strongly suggested to obtain appropriate insurance coverage while living in Thailand.



No. 02 - Visa Information

All exchange students are strongly encouraged to obtain student visa (Non-Immigrant/Non-ED) prior to their departure for Thailand. Students are eligible to apply for a student visa at the nearest Royal Thai Embassy or Royal Thai Consulate in their home countries.



No. 03 - Off-campus Housing

MSMU does not offer on-campus accommodation. Inbound exchange students can find a wide selection of apartments with different rent rates and facilities. These apartments are safe and clean, located nearby Mahidol University where public transportation is accessible.
